Since our creation in January of 2012, Credit Union of Colorado Foundation has promoted community development by providing financial and volunteer support in the areas of education and human services. Since that inception we've been able to grant over \$1.6 million dollars to very deserving individuals and organizations, making real on-the-ground differences in hundreds of communities and lives. We are proud of the benefits we have been able to help deliver and look forward to sharing the results and accomplishments of our past year's efforts.

In 2023, the 13,024 credit union members who have joined the Foundation helped our grants reach new highs:

\$52,780 in Colorado State Employees Assistance Program (C-SEAP) grants to 175 individuals in need

32 non-profit organizations received grants totaling \$57,375

\$50,000 awarded in scholarships to 10 high-performing students

\$167,235 in total grants made between July 1, 2023 and June 30, 2024

We're also excited to announce a renewed focus going forward: we will be focusing our efforts on education, including both student scholarships and educator grants, in order to have the greatest impact on today's students as well as those of tomorrow.

Foundation for Colorado Community Colleges

The Foundation for Colorado Community Colleges works closely with the 13 community colleges located across the state. Scholarships are their primary focus, providing more than \$1 million in scholarships annually to make college possible for deserving students. They also invest in key programs and initiatives that meet the workforce needs of the 21st century and help students develop a path to full-time employment after graduation, and support and strengthen our community colleges so that they can offer exceptional higher education opportunities to their students.

They have also created innovative programs such as "Return to Earn," which reengages students who were close to completing college but then left—stopped out—before getting a degree. The program puts them back on a path to a college credential and better career opportunities. Another program is based on research that shows students who have a relationship-based advisor show much greater success. More than merely an advisor, the "Navigators" program teams a student with a qualified advisor/mentor who gets to know the student and proactively checks in to ensure progress on their academic plans.

Based in Boulder, Impact on Education is the foundation supporting 28,000 students and 4,000 educators in the Boulder Valley School District. Since 1983, they've provided supplemental funding and resources to students and educators in order to expand what's possible in education. They equalize opportunity, bolster academic success, and galvanize community engagement to create lasting change. Through their investments, they address systemic barriers that impact students based on socioeconomic status, race, gender, class and other marginalized identities.

Their comprehensive programs cover early childhood education, college and career readiness, and mental health, all with an emphasis on equalizing opportunity in education across racial and socioeconomic lines.

Based in Durango, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southwest Colorado provides one-to-one mentors for any youth, ages 6-17 years old. Their mission is to create and support one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of youth.

Their goals for the youth they serve are focused in areas that have a positive and long-term impact in each of the children's lives: increased self-confidence, improved academic performance, increased interest in learning, and stronger, positive relationships with humankind through increased sense of belonging. As they say, "Our volunteer Bigs are making impact on their Littles, and we believe are the heart of our programs."

We started the Foundation with the belief that education is the engine that drives one's ability to have greater success in life as well as to make a stronger impact on society and one's local community.
